## The United States Constitution

Article II, Section 1 of the U.S. Constitution imposes only three eligibility requirements on persons serving as president, based on the officeholder's age, time of residency in the U.S., and citizenship status:

## U.S. Constitution – Presidential Candidate Eligibility

"No person except a natural born Citizen, or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of President; neither shall any person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been fourteen Years a Resident within the United States."

## EXECUTIVE ORDER

### Establishing the United States Global Accountability and Sovereign Impact Review Task Force

**By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, including [specific statutes like the Defense Production Act of 1950, as amended (50 U.S.C. 4501 et seq.)], and section 301 of title 3, United States Code, it is hereby ordered as follows:**

#### Preamble

The United States exercises significant influence in global affairs. The effects of its policies, actions, and economic relationships have extended beyond its borders and have shaped outcomes for nations, communities, and individuals across the world.

A nation grounded in the rule of law and accountable governance must be willing to examine the full impact of its actions—openly, carefully, and based on evidence.

The United States is not reducible to the actions taken in its name by every administration, contractor, financier, or private network of influence. The American people did not knowingly authorize every consequence borne by others abroad. However, where public institutions have

been used, misused, or influenced in ways that contributed to harm, there exists a responsibility to examine those actions and address them through lawful and transparent means.

This effort recognizes that many individuals and communities, both within the United States and internationally, may not have had full visibility into the impacts of these actions. It further recognizes that meaningful public understanding requires both access to information and the capacity to engage with it.

Accountability is necessary to maintain the integrity of public institutions and to strengthen trust. However, accountability must be pursued in a manner consistent with the rule of law and with a focus on preventing future harm.

History has demonstrated that cycles of retaliation and retribution do not resolve underlying causes of conflict. They perpetuate them. For this reason, this effort is grounded in the principle that accountability must not become revenge.

The purpose of this initiative is to promote truth, strengthen institutional integrity, support informed public understanding, and contribute to long-term global stability.

This effort begins with the United States. It is undertaken with the recognition that a more stable and cooperative international system depends on the willingness of nations, over time, to examine their own actions with honesty and responsibility.

Through this process, the United States seeks to lead not through accusation, but through example.

### **Section 1. Purpose.**

This order establishes a comprehensive, independent, and evidence-based review of the historical and current impacts of United States policies, actions, and economic activities on foreign populations, sovereign lands, and international systems.

This review is being prepared for implementation at the earliest opportunity under the full constitutional authority of the United States government.

The purpose of this effort is to strengthen transparency, accountability, and long-term global stability. It is not intended to assign collective guilt or pursue retaliatory action, but to ensure that the institutions of the United States remain aligned with the principles they are intended to serve.

---

### **Section 2. Establishment of the Task Force.**

(a) There is hereby established the *Global Accountability and Sovereign Impact Review Task Force* (the “Task Force”).

(b) The Task Force shall operate with independence and integrity and include:

- Representatives from relevant Federal agencies
- Experts in international law, economics, and history
- Representatives from human rights and civil society organizations
- Bipartisan appointees, including representation from minority party leadership
- Independent advisors from the international community, including partner nations and representatives of affected populations

(c) International participation shall be structured to enhance transparency, credibility, and shared understanding, while preserving the constitutional authority of the United States.

---

### **Section 3. Scope of Review.**

The Task Force shall investigate, as appropriate:

- (a) U.S. foreign policy actions, including military, intelligence, and economic interventions;
  - (b) Relationships between U.S. institutions and private entities operating internationally;
  - (c) Financial systems, trade structures, and debt relationships involving U.S. influence;
  - (d) The impact of such activities on sovereignty, economic independence, and social outcomes in affected nations;
  - (e) Whether patterns of systemic harm, dependency, or inequitable extraction have occurred.

### **Section 4. Definitions.**

(a) “Systemic Harm” refers to demonstrable and sustained adverse impacts on populations or nations, including but not limited to:

- Violations of internationally recognized human rights
- Undermining of national sovereignty or democratic processes
- Documented economic exploitation or extraction patterns
- Long-term destabilization of social or economic systems

(b) “Accountability” refers to lawful, evidence-based processes conducted through appropriate constitutional and legal channels, including referral to Congress, regulatory agencies, or courts.

---

### **Section 5. Reporting Requirements.**

(a) Within 24 months of formal implementation, the Task Force shall submit a comprehensive report.

(b) The report shall include:

- Verified findings supported by evidence
- Case studies of affected nations or populations
- Identification of relevant structures, systems, or actors
- Policy recommendations for reform, prevention, and, where appropriate, restorative measures

(c) The report shall be made publicly available globally, with appropriate translations, except where classified information requires protection.

---

### **Section 6. National Security and Classified Information.**

(a) The Task Force shall have access to relevant classified materials subject to applicable law.

(b) A secure review process shall be established for sensitive information.

(c) A classified annex may be produced, with declassification timelines where appropriate.

(d) Transparency shall be balanced with the protection of national security.

### **Section 7. Principles of Response.**

If the Task Force identifies systemic harm linked to U.S. actions or structures, the United States shall:

- (a) Acknowledge findings transparently;
- (b) Engage diplomatically with affected nations;
- (c) Prioritize restorative, forward-looking solutions;
- (d) Avoid collective punishment or destabilizing actions;
- (e) Uphold the rule of law in all subsequent actions.

Accountability shall be pursued through lawful and constructive means and shall not be used to justify retaliation or cycles of retributive harm.

---

### **Section 8. Congressional Engagement and Restorative Measures.**

(a) The Administration shall present findings to Congress with recommendations for:

- Legislative reforms
- Oversight mechanisms
- Creation of a potential *Restorative Impact Fund*

(b) Any funding, restitution, or enforcement actions shall be determined through Congressional authority and existing legal frameworks.

---

### **Section 9. Private Sector Review and Referral.**

(a) Where evidence indicates potential unlawful or unethical conduct by private entities, findings shall be referred to appropriate regulatory or judicial bodies.

(b) No enforcement action shall be taken outside established legal processes.

---

### **Section 10. Education and Public Awareness.**

(a) The Secretary of Education shall develop recommendations for incorporating verified findings into educational materials.

(b) Public-facing materials shall be developed to improve accessibility and understanding of the findings for the American people and the international community.

(c) These efforts shall emphasize historical understanding, ethical responsibility, and prevention of future systemic harm.

---

## **Section 11. Guiding Principle: Forward Stability.**

This initiative shall not be used to pursue revenge or retaliation. Its purpose is to:

- Promote truth and transparency
- Strengthen global trust
- Prevent recurrence of harm
- Support long-term cooperation and stability

This effort begins with the United States, but it does not end here. A more stable and just world requires that nations are willing, over time, to examine their actions with honesty and responsibility.

---

## **Section 12. Implementation.**

All executive departments and agencies shall cooperate fully with the Task Force and provide access to relevant information consistent with applicable law.

---
