The United States Constitution

Article II, Section 1 of the U.S. Constitution imposes only three eligibility requirements on persons serving as president, based on the officeholder's age, time of residency in the U.S., and citizenship status:

U.S. Constitution – Presidential Candidate Eligibility

"No person except a natural born Citizen, or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of President; neither shall any person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been fourteen Years a Resident within the United States."

An Open Letter to Our Global Family:

On the Crusade Against the Human Being, the Weaponization of "Illegal," and a Country Being Destroyed for Generations

Dear Global Family,

To Jackson and every TSA agent, DHS employee, and essential worker—those we see and those we may never know—I am sorry you are going through this. You are seen. You matter. And this should never have happened to you.

I am writing to you today because something is happening that we must name clearly.

This is not about border security. This is not about protecting the public. This is a crusade—a political and moral crusade—against the very idea that every human being is a human being. And it is being waged by people who are actively destroying the United States for generations to come.

They have weaponized the word "illegal." They have turned it into a label that strips away humanity. Once you are "illegal," in their telling, you are no longer entitled to dignity. No longer entitled to due process. No longer entitled to be seen as a person.

You become raw material. A problem to be solved. A body to be removed, imprisoned, or destroyed.

This is not new. This is the oldest trick in the book of cruelty: first dehumanize, then destroy. But what is new is the speed. What is new is the openness. What is new is that they are no longer pretending.

And while they wage this crusade against the vulnerable, they are also turning the machinery of government against anyone who might stop them—including the essential workers who keep the country running.

Let me introduce you to a man named Jackson Oliverio.

Step One: The Crusade Has a Human Cost

Jackson works for the Transportation Security Administration (TSA). He is one of the thousands of federal employees currently working without pay during the government shutdown that began on February 14, 2026—now in its 38th day.

Yesterday, he worked a twelve-hour shift. 4:00 AM to 4:30 PM. He secured the airport. He kept travelers safe. And he will not be paid for it.

Jackson is not "illegal." He is a federal employee. A TSA officer. An American worker. But in the logic of the crusade, he is still disposable. Because the crusade is not really about immigration. It is about power. It is about who counts as human and who does not.

The TSA officers working without pay are being used as leverage in a fight over immigration policy. Democrats and Republicans alike have decided that DHS employees—TSA, border patrol, immigration officials—are acceptable collateral damage. Their labor is required. Their survival is optional.

Meanwhile, Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents are still being paid. Why? Because they were funded through 2029 by a separate \$170 billion bill passed last

year. So the agents who round up the people labeled "illegal" get their paychecks. The agents who keep the airports running do not.

That is not an accident. That is a statement about who matters and who does not.

Step Two: The Label "Illegal" Is a Weapon

Let us be clear about what is happening.

The administration and its allies have spent years teaching Americans to see certain human beings as less than human. They use the word "illegal" not as a description of status but as a moral verdict. They call people "peasants." They call people "vermin." They say that some people are "poisoning the blood" of the country.

This language is not rhetorical excess. It is the necessary precondition for atrocity. Before you send people to an offshore prison, you must first convince yourself they are not really people. Before you separate families, you must first convince yourself they are not really families. Before you force essential workers to labor without pay, you must first convince yourself that some people are essential enough to exploit but not essential enough to pay.

The word "illegal" has become a license to do anything. To detain without trial. To imprison without charge. To deport without process. To use as leverage without conscience.

And now, the same logic is being applied to anyone who gets in the way.

Step Three: This Crusade Is Destroying the Country for Generations

When a government decides that it can label any group as less than human, it does not stop with that group. The machinery of dehumanization always expands. Always.

We are already seeing the pattern:

- A Secretary of Defense who holds stock in defense contractors while ordering strikes on thousands of targets.
- Troops deployed domestically without the consent of governors—the first such deployment since 1965.
- A Pentagon that refuses to testify before Congress, that ignores inspectors general, that treats oversight as an obstacle to be overcome.
- A government shutdown that forces essential workers to labor without pay while the political class continues to collect its salaries.
- A president who has openly stated he will ignore judicial orders he disagrees with.
- A prison at Guantanamo Bay being expanded to hold 30,000 people—without charge, without lawyer, without trial.

This is not about border security. This is about dismantling the guardrails of democracy so that power can be exercised without accountability. And when power is exercised without accountability, it is always exercised against the vulnerable first. But it is never exercised against the vulnerable only.

The same apparatus being built to detain the "illegal" will be turned against citizens. Against journalists. Against political opponents. Against anyone the powerful decide to label a threat.

That is not a conspiracy theory. That is how every authoritarian movement in history has operated. First, you name an enemy. Then, you build the machinery to crush them. Then, you turn the machinery on anyone who resists.

The United States is in the middle of this process right now. And the people who are doing it do not care what they destroy—because they do not plan to live in the world they are leaving behind for the rest of us.

Step Four: Who Is the Real Threat?

The administration wants you to believe the threat comes from across the border. From desperate families. From asylum-seekers. From people with nothing but the clothes on their backs. They call these people "vermin." They call them "illegal." They say we must sacrifice our humanity to be safe.

But the real threat is not the vulnerable. The real threat is the ones who use human suffering to consolidate power. The real threat is the ones who imprison people without trial to prove they can. The real threat is the ones who dismantle the guardrails of democracy—inspectors general, ethics rules, congressional oversight—so that they can privatize the government's power for their own enrichment.

The real threat is the crusade against the human being. The crusade that says some people are not really people. The crusade that treats "illegal" as a justification for anything. The crusade that is actively destroying a country that was never perfect but at least pretended to believe in something better.

That crusade is not protecting anyone. It is destroying everyone—including the Americans who think they are safe because they are not the target today.

We are writing to you because we have seen what happens when the world looks away. We know the history. We know what it meant when other nations chose not to intervene as democratic institutions were dismantled one by one. We are not yet at that point—but we are on the path, and the pace is accelerating.

We ask the global community to recognize what is happening and to act.

1. Refuse the Label "Illegal."

The word "illegal" when applied to a human being is not a legal category. It is a moral weapon. Refuse to use it. Refuse to accept it. Every human being has dignity, regardless of paperwork. Every human being has rights, regardless of borders. Every human being is a human being—and the moment we accept that some are not, we have already lost.

2. Publicly Condemn the Use of Essential Workers as Political Leverage.

Forcing essential workers to labor without pay is not governance. It is hostage-taking. Every nation that still claims to value human dignity should state clearly: this is unacceptable.

3. Recognize That This Is a Global Pattern.

The same dehumanization is happening everywhere. The same labeling of some people as disposable. The same extraction of labor without compensation. The same consolidation of power by those who claim to protect but actually destroy. We are not fighting only for America. We are fighting for a world where no one is considered less than human.

4. Prepare for a Post-Accountability World.

The United States under this administration is becoming an unreliable partner—not because of incompetence, but because of intent. Nations should begin contingency planning. Strengthen regional alliances. Diversify supply chains. Reduce dependence on a country whose leadership has shown it will abandon any commitment when it becomes politically convenient.

5. Offer Asylum to Those Targeted.

Many of those being labeled "illegal" and sent to Guantanamo—and many more who will be targeted next—are legitimate asylum-seekers. We ask nations to make clear that they will welcome those fleeing this government's persecution.

On Moral Grounds

For those who hold religious or moral convictions, an additional question must be asked.

If we believe that every human being is created with dignity—that no one is disposable, that the label "illegal" does not erase the image of God—then what are we to make of leaders who treat these truths as obstacles to be overcome?

The same hands that sign orders sending people to Guantanamo also hold press conferences boasting of their cruelty. The same voices that call human beings "vermin" also demand the loyalty of those who should be holding them accountable. The same administration that claims to protect the nation is actively building the capacity to imprison without trial, to kill without oversight, to rule without consent.

There is a difference between power and dominion.

Power asks: What can I do? Dominion asks: What am I responsible for?

We have placed power in the hands of men and women who do not appear to feel the weight of dominion. And that absence is not a political problem—it is a human problem. A spiritual problem. A problem for anyone who believes that the earth, the vulnerable, and the future are not ours to destroy.

Scripture is not silent on what is required.

When you call a human being "illegal," you speak that name over your Creator. When you imprison the asylum-seeker without trial, you imprison Christ. When you force essential workers to labor without pay, you tell the One who made them that their labor has value but their life does not.

You cannot claim to represent God while treating God's children as disposable. The fruit does not lie.

What We Are Asking

This letter is not addressed to the administration. They have made it clear they do not answer to letters—or to law, or to conscience.

This letter is addressed to us—the global public, the voters, the neighbors, the faith communities, the journalists, the diplomats, the essential workers, the ones who still believe that accountability matters.

We are asking:

- **That we refuse the label "illegal."** We will not call any human being by a word designed to strip them of dignity.
- **That we stand with essential workers.** Jackson Oliverio and his colleagues are not invisible. Their sacrifice is not acceptable. Their labor is not optional to be paid only when convenient.
- **That we recognize this crusade for what it is:** not a policy disagreement, but a moral war against the idea that all humans are human.

- **That we refuse to normalize the abnormal.** A government that forces essential workers to labor without pay while funding its priorities is not functional. It is cruel. Report it as such.
- **That we prepare for what is coming.** The machinery being built will not be dismantled by hoping. It will be dismantled by organizing.
- **That we refuse to look away.** History will not forgive those who saw and said nothing.
- **And that we protect those who speak out.** Any government official—TSA officer, whistleblower, inspector general, or civil servant—who faces retaliation, termination, or harm for speaking truth to power during this crisis will have a protector in this candidate. When I am President, I will use the full authority of the Grant Office and repurpose unused federal funds to ensure that any such individual is compensated **ten times the amount of their lost wages, damages, or harm suffered**. I am confident the global community will stand with us in ensuring that those who defend human dignity are never left to suffer alone.

A Closing Word

History will not ask whether we were comfortable. It will ask whether we were present. Whether we saw. Whether we spoke.

We are living through a test of our institutions, our alliances, and our moral coherence. The outcome is not yet determined. But it will be determined by whether enough of us—here in the United States and around the world—refuse to look away.

I am refusing.

I hope you will too.
