### The United States Constitution

Article II, Section 1 of the U.S. Constitution imposes only three eligibility requirements on persons serving as president, based on the officeholder's age, time of residency in the U.S., and citizenship status:

### U.S. Constitution – Presidential Candidate Eligibility

"No person except a natural born Citizen, or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of President; neither shall any person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been fourteen Years a Resident within the United States."

### To the American People,

The United States has always stood on a set of principles—freedom, accountability, and the belief that power must answer to the people.

Those principles are not tested when things are easy. They are tested when we are willing to examine ourselves honestly.

Today, I have signed an Executive Order establishing the Global Accountability and Sovereign Impact Review Task Force for 2029. I invite the current president and administration to use this order today for accountability should he find an interest. Its purpose is straightforward: to conduct a serious, evidence-based review of how actions taken in the name of the United States have affected people, nations, and systems beyond our borders.

This effort is not about assigning collective guilt to the American people.

Most Americans today are navigating real economic pressure—rising costs of living, housing, healthcare, and daily necessities that require sustained attention simply to maintain stability. These conditions naturally narrow focus toward immediate needs and limit the time and capacity to engage with complex issues beyond our borders.

This effort recognizes that reality. A fully informed and engaged public requires not only access to information, but the space and stability to process it. Strengthening our nation means working toward both.

The United States is not reducible to the actions taken in its name by every administration, contractor, financier, or private network of influence. The American people did not knowingly authorize every consequence borne by others abroad. But where public institutions were used,

misused, or captured to produce harm, the nation has a responsibility to confront the truth and address it through lawful and transparent means.

**This is not a sign of weakness. It is a demonstration of strength.**

A nation confident in its values does not avoid scrutiny—it invites it. Not to tear itself down, but to ensure it remains aligned with the principles it was built upon.

I know that for some, this effort may raise concerns. It may feel uncomfortable. It may raise difficult questions. That is part of the responsibility we carry as a nation that holds global influence.

We also recognize that when harm is revealed, the desire for revenge can feel justified—especially for those who have experienced real loss.

We do not dismiss that reality. Accountability is necessary. Truth is necessary. Education is necessary.

But we must also be clear: if accountability turns into revenge, we risk repeating the very cycles that created harm in the first place. Retaliation may feel like justice in the moment, but it does not build stability, it does not restore trust, and it does not create a future where those harms are less likely to occur.

Moving forward requires something more difficult—and more powerful.

It requires that we understand what happened, how it happened, and ensure it cannot happen again. It requires that we equip future generations with the knowledge to recognize and prevent these patterns. And it requires that we choose a path that leads to shared stability and long-term cooperation.

A future of greater global stability and abundance will not be built through cycles of revenge. It will be built through accountability, understanding, and the discipline to move forward together.

We will not pursue retaliation. We will pursue truth, responsibility, and a stronger foundation for the future.

We will not allow this effort to diminish the sacrifices made by those who have served this country in good faith.

Instead, we will move forward with discipline, clarity, and a commitment to the rule of law.
