The United States Constitution

Article II, Section 1 of the U.S. Constitution imposes only three eligibility requirements on persons serving as president, based on the officeholder's age, time of residency in the U.S., and citizenship status:

U.S. Constitution – Presidential Candidate Eligibility

"No person except a natural born Citizen, or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of President; neither shall any person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty-five Years, and been fourteen Years a Resident within the United States."

Executive Order 2029-13

OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

Prohibiting Corporate Surveillance, Behavioral Manipulation, and the Outsourcing of Population Control Against the American People

PREAMBLE

The Constitution of the United States was written to protect the American people from the concentration of power — in any form, in any institution, under any justification.

The rights enshrined in the Bill of Rights are not procedural technicalities. They are the foundational compact between a free people and the government they created. They establish, without ambiguity, that the American people are not to be surveilled without cause, not to be controlled without consent, and not to be managed as a population by any authority — governmental or otherwise.

For decades, that compact has been systematically violated.

Federal agencies have contracted with private corporations to perform surveillance functions the Constitution prohibits government from conducting directly. Private entities — data brokers, artificial intelligence firms, behavioral analytics companies, and social media platforms — have constructed surveillance and behavioral manipulation infrastructure of a scale and sophistication that no government in history has possessed. Institutional investors and private equity firms have financed this infrastructure not in service of the public interest but in service of extraction, compliance, and control.

The result is a public-private surveillance architecture that operates outside constitutional constraint, outside democratic accountability, and outside the consent of the governed.

This Executive Order establishes that it ends.

The American people are not a managed population. They are not a data asset. They are not a behavioral system to be optimized. They are free citizens of a sovereign republic, and this administration will govern them as such.

The enforcement of these protections shall not rest with the executive branch alone. New federal agencies can be captured, defunded, or weaponized against the very people they were created to protect. The Cordova administration will not build another bureaucratic instrument that a future administration can turn against the states or the public. Instead, this Order calls upon Congress to establish a Constitutional People's Counsel — an independent officer of Congress, accountable to the public and to all three branches, that belongs to the people and cannot be removed or redirected by any President.

SECTION 1 — AUTHORITY

This Order is issued pursuant to the President's authority under:

- Article II, Section 1 of the Constitution of the United States
- The Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR), 48 C.F.R. § 1.1 et seq.
- The Privacy Act of 1974, 5 U.S.C. § 552a
- The Federal Property and Administrative Services Act, 40 U.S.C. § 101 et seq.
- Executive authority over the intelligence community pursuant to Executive Order 12333 and its successors
- The President's inherent authority to direct the operations of the executive branch and protect constitutional rights
- National security authority under 50 U.S.C. § 3001 et seq.

SECTION 2 — FINDINGS

The President finds that:

2.1 Private corporations currently possess surveillance capabilities exceeding those of any government in history, including the capacity to collect, store, process, and act upon behavioral data covering the entire civilian population of the United States without individualized consent, judicial oversight, or constitutional constraint.

2.2 Federal agencies — including but not limited to the Department of Homeland Security, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Internal Revenue Service, and elements of the Intelligence Community — have purchased civilian surveillance data from private brokers to circumvent the Fourth Amendment's warrant requirement, exploiting the legal fiction that data "voluntarily" surrendered to a private party carries no constitutional protection.

2.3 Artificial intelligence systems deployed by private corporations are being used to predict, profile, and alter the behavior of American civilians at population scale, including through the deliberate manipulation of information environments, the suppression or amplification of content based on behavioral compliance metrics, and the construction of psychological profiles used for targeting without the knowledge or consent of the individuals profiled.

2.4 The same small group of institutional asset managers — through their simultaneous ownership of surveillance technology companies, data brokers, artificial intelligence firms, social media platforms, and government contractors — has created a unified private surveillance and behavioral control infrastructure that operates with no democratic accountability and no public interest mandate.

2.5 The outsourcing of surveillance and behavioral control functions to private entities does not make those functions constitutional. What the government may not do directly, it may not accomplish indirectly through contractors, data purchases, or public-private partnerships.

2.6 A surveillance and behavioral manipulation infrastructure of this scale and integration constitutes a threat to democratic governance, individual liberty, and the sovereignty of the American people, and falls within the President's authority to address as a matter of national security, constitutional integrity, and public interest.

2.7 New executive branch agencies created to enforce civilian rights carry an inherent structural risk: they can be captured, defunded, or weaponized against the states and the public by future administrations. The appropriate enforcement structure is one that is independent of the executive, accountable to Congress and the public, and constitutionally insulated from removal by any President.

SECTION 3 — DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this Order:

3.1 "Mass Civilian Surveillance" means the collection, storage, aggregation, or processing of personal data on American civilians at a scale exceeding individualized, consent-based interaction, including but not limited to location tracking, behavioral profiling, biometric collection, communication monitoring, financial pattern analysis, and social graph mapping.

3.2 "Behavioral Manipulation" means the use of data, algorithms, artificial intelligence, or any other technological mechanism to alter, shape, predict, suppress, or direct the beliefs, behaviors, emotions, purchasing decisions, political views, or information environment of American civilians without their informed and specific consent.

3.3 "Surveillance Contractor" means any entity — domestic or foreign, incorporated or unincorporated, wherever organized or operating — that collects, brokers, analyzes, processes, or sells data derived from mass civilian surveillance of American civilians, or that provides behavioral manipulation services targeting American civilians, regardless of whether such entity holds a federal contract, and regardless of where such collection, processing, or sale occurs. Incorporation, registration, or operation outside the United States does not exempt any entity from this definition if its activities target or involve American civilians.

3.4 "The Public-Private Surveillance Loophole" means any arrangement, formal or informal, direct or indirect — including arrangements routed through foreign entities, foreign intermediaries, or offshore data processing operations — through which a federal agency or official obtains surveillance data, behavioral profiles, or analytical products derived from mass civilian surveillance from any private or foreign entity in lieu of conducting constitutionally compliant intelligence collection.

3.5 "Foreign Entity" means any entity incorporated, organized, headquartered, or primarily operated outside the United States, including any entity owned or controlled in whole or in part by a foreign government, foreign sovereign wealth fund, or foreign intelligence service, regardless of whether it also maintains operations within the United States.

3.6 "Data Export" means the transfer, transmission, sale, licensing, sharing, or any other conveyance of personal data relating to American civilians — in raw, processed, aggregated, or

derived form — to any foreign entity or to any location outside the jurisdiction of the United States.

3.7 "Institutional Holder" means any asset management firm, investment fund, or financial institution — domestic or foreign — that holds significant ownership stakes in surveillance contractors, data brokers, behavioral analytics firms, or artificial intelligence companies, enabling governance influence over those entities.

3.8 "Covered Agency" means any department, agency, office, or instrumentality of the executive branch of the United States government, including the Intelligence Community as defined in 50 U.S.C. § 3003.

SECTION 4 — PROHIBITIONS

4.1 Prohibition on Surveillance Contracting

No covered agency shall enter into, renew, extend, or maintain any contract, agreement, memorandum of understanding, or other arrangement with any surveillance contractor for the purpose of obtaining mass civilian surveillance data, behavioral profiles, psychological assessments, or derived analytical products relating to American civilians.

4.2 Prohibition on Data Purchases

No covered agency shall purchase, license, access, or otherwise acquire data derived from mass civilian surveillance of American civilians from any private entity, regardless of whether such entity is a party to a formal federal contract.

4.3 Closure of the Public-Private Surveillance Loophole

No covered agency, officer, employee, or official of the executive branch shall request, receive, or use any surveillance data, behavioral profile, or analytical product derived from mass civilian surveillance that could not have been collected by the government directly under the requirements of the Fourth Amendment, applicable statutory law, and existing executive orders governing intelligence activities.

This prohibition applies regardless of the form of the arrangement, the identity of the intermediary, or whether financial consideration was exchanged. Informal requests, voluntary

sharing arrangements, and data-sharing partnerships are prohibited to the same extent as formal contracts.

4.4 Prohibition on Behavioral Manipulation Contracts

No covered agency shall contract with, fund, or otherwise support any private entity for the purpose of designing, deploying, or operating behavioral manipulation systems directed at American civilians.

4.5 Prohibition on Participation in Joint Surveillance Infrastructure

No covered agency shall participate in, fund, or provide material support to any public-private partnership, fusion center, data-sharing consortium, or joint intelligence program that incorporates mass civilian surveillance data from private entities — domestic or foreign — in a manner that circumvents constitutional requirements applicable to direct government collection.

4.6 Prohibition on Acquisition of Exported American Civilian Data

No covered agency shall purchase, access, receive, or otherwise acquire personal data relating to American civilians that has been exported to a foreign entity for processing, storage, or analysis and subsequently returned or made available to domestic entities, where such acquisition would be prohibited if the data had been collected and processed domestically under this Order or applicable constitutional law.

The routing of American civilian surveillance data through a foreign intermediary does not cleanse it of constitutional infirmity. The government may not acquire offshore what it is prohibited from collecting at home.

4.7 Prohibition on Acquisition from Foreign Entities and Foreign Governments

No covered agency shall purchase, receive, or otherwise acquire personal data, behavioral profiles, psychological assessments, or derived analytical products relating to American civilians from any foreign entity, foreign government, foreign state-owned enterprise, or foreign intelligence service, where such acquisition would be prohibited if the data had been obtained from a domestic private entity under this Order.

No covered agency shall enter into any intelligence-sharing arrangement, liaison relationship, or data exchange agreement with any foreign government or foreign intelligence service that has

the purpose or effect of obtaining American civilian surveillance data that the covered agency could not lawfully collect or purchase domestically.

SECTION 5 — IMMEDIATE ACTIONS

5.1 Contract Review and Termination

Within 30 days of the date of this Order, the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, in coordination with the heads of all covered agencies, shall conduct a comprehensive review of all existing contracts, agreements, and data-sharing arrangements and shall identify any that involve the acquisition of mass civilian surveillance data or behavioral manipulation services from private entities.

All contracts identified under this review that violate the prohibitions of Section 4 shall be terminated within 60 days of identification.

5.2 Intelligence Community Compliance

The Director of National Intelligence shall issue binding guidance to all elements of the Intelligence Community implementing the prohibitions of this Order within 30 days and shall report to the President within 90 days on all existing arrangements terminated and all modifications made to bring ongoing programs into compliance.

5.3 Federal Acquisition Regulation Amendment

The Federal Acquisition Regulatory Council shall initiate rulemaking within 60 days to amend the Federal Acquisition Regulation to permanently prohibit the procurement of mass civilian surveillance data and behavioral manipulation services from private entities.

5.4 Public Disclosure

Within 90 days, the Attorney General, in coordination with the Director of National Intelligence, shall submit to Congress and publish for public review an unclassified report identifying the categories of surveillance data purchase and behavioral manipulation contracting that have occurred, the agencies involved, the contractors involved, and the legal authorities cited to justify those arrangements.

Classification shall not be used to withhold from the American public information about programs that violate their constitutional rights.

SECTION 6 — STRUCTURAL PROHIBITIONS ON CORPORATE SURVEILLANCE INFRASTRUCTURE

6.1 Universal Prohibition — No Threshold

No entity — regardless of size, revenue, federal contract status, or relationship to government — shall engage in mass civilian surveillance or behavioral manipulation of American civilians without the express, specific, and revocable informed consent of each individual surveilled or targeted.

The prohibition in this section is not conditioned on receipt of federal contracts, grants, loans, or any other federal benefit. Mass civilian surveillance and behavioral manipulation are prohibited because they violate the rights of free people — not because of the entity's relationship to federal spending. No threshold of size or federal entanglement shall define the boundary of this prohibition.

6.2 Affiliate and Network Liability — Closing the Fragmentation Loophole

The prohibitions of this Order apply to the aggregate surveillance and behavioral manipulation activity of any affiliated group of entities, not merely to each entity in isolation.

(a) Any private equity firm, institutional asset manager, parent company, holding company, or controlling investor that finances, directs, coordinates, or benefits from mass civilian surveillance or behavioral manipulation conducted by any entity within its ownership, investment, or control structure shall be jointly and severally liable for all violations committed by those entities, to the same extent as if the controlling entity had conducted the surveillance directly.

(b) Liability under this section shall attach regardless of how many separate legal entities are interposed between the controlling investor and the entity conducting surveillance, and regardless of whether any individual entity in the chain independently meets any threshold or trigger under other provisions of law.

(c) An institutional holder or private equity firm that holds a significant ownership stake in, or exercises governance influence over, any entity engaged in mass civilian surveillance or

behavioral manipulation shall be presumed to have knowledge of and responsibility for that activity unless it can affirmatively demonstrate that it took specific, documented steps to prohibit and prevent the activity.

6.3 Anti-Fragmentation Clause

No person, entity, or affiliated group of entities shall structure, divide, or reorganize surveillance or behavioral manipulation operations across multiple legal entities for the purpose — or with the effect — of avoiding the prohibitions of this Order or any statute enacted pursuant to it.

(a) The deliberate fragmentation of a surveillance operation across multiple entities to circumvent a prohibition or threshold constitutes a violation of this Order independent of and in addition to any underlying surveillance violation.

(b) Where the aggregate data collected, purchased, or processed by affiliated entities — whether or not individually subject to a prohibition — constitutes mass civilian surveillance, the controlling entity and all affiliates shall be treated as a single covered entity for purposes of this Order.

(c) The Department of Justice is directed to treat the structuring of surveillance operations to evade legal prohibition with the same seriousness as financial structuring to evade anti-money laundering law.

6.4 Prohibition on Psychological and Information Manipulation

No entity shall deploy any system, tool, algorithm, or artificial intelligence mechanism for the purpose of psychologically manipulating American civilians — including but not limited to:

(a) Deliberately engineering emotional states — including fear, anger, anxiety, or social isolation — in individuals or populations through content curation, algorithmic amplification, or targeted information delivery, without the informed consent of those individuals;

(b) Constructing or maintaining filter bubbles, echo chambers, or information environments designed to restrict the range of information available to an individual for the purpose of producing ideological conformity, political compliance, or behavioral control;

(c) Deploying dark patterns, addictive design mechanisms, or compulsive engagement systems intended to override the autonomous decision-making of users;

(d) Using behavioral profile data to identify and exploit psychological vulnerabilities — including grief, fear, loneliness, financial stress, or addiction — for the purpose of targeting, manipulation, or compliance production;

(e) Operating sentiment manipulation campaigns that systematically amplify division, demoralization, or social distrust within the American civilian population, whether for commercial, political, or governmental purposes;

(f) Using artificial intelligence to generate, amplify, or distribute synthetic or misleading content — including deepfakes, fabricated narratives, or coordinated inauthentic behavior — for the purpose of altering the beliefs or behaviors of American civilians.

6.5 Prohibition on AI-Driven Population Profiling

No entity shall use artificial intelligence systems to construct behavioral profiles, psychological assessments, predictive compliance models, or dissent identification tools applied to American civilians for sale to, or use on behalf of, any government entity — federal, state, or local — or for any purpose of population management or control.

6.6 Prohibition on Functional Surveillance Surrogates

No private entity shall operate as a functional surrogate for government surveillance by providing services — through any structure, intermediary, or arrangement — that the government is constitutionally prohibited from performing directly. The interposition of a private entity between the government and a prohibited surveillance function does not make that function lawful.

6.7 Enforcement

Violations of this section shall be referred to the Department of Justice for investigation and, where appropriate, criminal and civil prosecution under applicable federal statutes. The FTC shall have concurrent civil enforcement authority. State Attorneys General shall have concurrent authority to bring actions on behalf of their residents. No violation of this section shall be shielded from enforcement by corporate structure, ownership complexity, or the subdivision of surveillance activity across affiliated entities.

6.8 Prohibition on the Commodification and Sale of American Civilian Data

The American people have made clear, in poll after poll, across every political affiliation, that they do not want their personal data sold without their consent. 84% support stricter federal data privacy laws. 73% say they lack adequate control over how their data is used. They are not confused. They are not divided. They are waiting for a government that will listen. This administration listens.

(a) No covered entity shall sell, license, transfer, or otherwise exchange for consideration any personal data relating to American civilians without the specific, transaction-level informed consent of each individual whose data is included. Consent given to the original data collector does not transfer to any subsequent sale. Each transaction requires its own independent consent.

(b) No covered entity shall sell or transfer in bulk any aggregated behavioral profiles, psychological models, demographic targeting packages, or population-level data sets derived from American civilians, regardless of whether individual elements were collected with consent.

(c) No covered entity shall sell, license, or transfer — under any circumstances, for any consideration, regardless of any purported consent — any data that identifies, predicts, or scores the psychological vulnerabilities of American civilians, including grief, trauma, mental health indicators, addiction vulnerability, financial distress, loneliness, fear profiles, or manipulation susceptibility assessments. A person's psychological vulnerabilities are not a product. This prohibition is absolute.

(d) No covered entity shall sell or transfer personal data in sensitive categories — including precise geolocation history, health and biometric data, religious beliefs, political beliefs, sexual orientation, immigration status, or data relating to minors — without express, affirmative, written, transaction-specific consent that is not conditioned on access to any product or service.

(e) Every resale of American civilian data is an independent violation. Liability travels with the data through every transaction in the resale chain. No party in the chain may assert as a defense that it received the data from a prior seller who warranted compliance.

(f) The President calls upon Congress to establish a **National Do Not Sell Registry** — a free, permanent, simple mechanism through which any American civilian may prohibit the sale of their personal data by any covered entity — and a **National Data Transaction Registry** through which any American may see what transactions have involved their data, who purchased it, and for what stated purpose.

(g) No federal agency shall purchase, receive, or otherwise acquire any personal data relating to American civilians that was sold in violation of this section. The existence of a commercial sale

does not cleanse the constitutional infirmity of government acquisition of data the government could not lawfully collect directly.

SECTION 7 — ENFORCEMENT: EXISTING AGENCIES PENDING CONGRESSIONAL ACTION

7.1 Pending the establishment by Congress of the Constitutional People's Counsel described in Section 10 of this Order, enforcement responsibility under this Order shall be shared as follows:

(a) **The Federal Trade Commission** shall serve as the primary civil enforcement body for violations of Section 6 by corporate entities, exercising its existing authority under 15 U.S.C. § 45 and any additional authority granted by Congress.

(b) **The Department of Justice, Civil Division** shall enforce violations by government agencies and officials.

(c) **The Department of Justice, Criminal Division** shall prosecute criminal violations.

(d) **The Inspectors General** of all covered agencies are directed to treat compliance with this Order as a priority oversight matter and to report violations directly to Congress as well as to the President.

7.2 No single executive branch official or agency shall serve as the sole enforcement authority for these prohibitions. The structural intent of this Order is distributed accountability — no President, including this one, shall hold unchecked enforcement authority over civilian sovereignty protections.

7.3 State Attorneys General are expressly recognized as having concurrent enforcement authority to bring actions on behalf of their residents for violations occurring within their states. The federal government shall not preempt state enforcement of these protections.

SECTION 8 — RELATIONSHIP TO EXISTING LAW

8.1 This Order supplements and does not supersede existing constitutional protections, statutory privacy laws, or executive orders governing intelligence activities, except to the extent that

existing orders or guidance have been used to authorize the public-private surveillance loophole prohibited by Section 4.3.

8.2 Executive Order 12333 and its amendments are hereby modified to the extent they have been interpreted to permit covered agencies to acquire mass civilian surveillance data from private entities without constitutional compliance. The Director of National Intelligence shall issue revised guidance consistent with this modification within 30 days.

8.3 No agency head, contractor, or official shall construe any existing authority as permitting conduct prohibited by this Order. In cases of conflict, this Order controls within the executive branch.

SECTION 9 — ACCOUNTABILITY

9.1 Any officer or employee of the executive branch who knowingly violates the prohibitions of this Order shall be subject to removal from federal employment, referral for criminal prosecution, and civil liability.

9.2 Any federal contractor found to have provided surveillance data or behavioral manipulation services in violation of this Order shall be permanently debarred from federal contracting and referred to the Department of Justice.

9.3 No classification, national security designation, or invocation of state secrets shall be used to shield from accountability any violation of this Order.

9.4 Congress is expressly invited to exercise its full oversight authority over compliance with this Order. The administration will cooperate fully with any congressional investigation, hearing, or audit related to enforcement of these prohibitions — including against this administration itself.

SECTION 10 — CALL FOR THE CONSTITUTIONAL PEOPLE'S COUNSEL

10.1 The President calls upon Congress to establish, by statute and ultimately by constitutional amendment, the **Constitutional People's Counsel** — an independent officer of Congress, not of

the executive branch, who serves as the permanent public advocate for the constitutional rights of the American people against all concentrations of power, whether governmental or corporate.

10.2 The Constitutional People's Counsel shall be structured so that:

- (a) It cannot be removed by the President under any circumstances;
- (b) Its funding is provided through mandatory appropriations written into statute, not subject to executive budget manipulation;
- (c) It is accountable to Congress through oversight and to the public through mandatory quarterly transparency reporting;
- (d) It has independent standing to bring civil and constitutional actions in federal court on behalf of American civilians against corporations, against federal agencies, against state governments, and against any other actor that violates civilian sovereignty protections;
- (e) It receives constitutional complaints directly from the public and routes enforcement referrals to the FTC, DOJ, State Attorneys General, and other appropriate bodies while retaining independent litigation authority;
- (f) It operates with full subpoena authority granted by Congress;
- (g) It publishes complete, unclassified public reports to Congress on a quarterly basis.

10.3 The Constitutional People's Counsel is not a new bureaucracy. It is a public defender for the Constitution — structured like the Comptroller General or the Congressional Budget Office: politically insulated, institutionally durable, and belonging entirely to the public it serves.

10.4 No future President shall be able to fire the People's Counsel, redirect its mandate, cut its funding unilaterally, or use it as an instrument against the states or the public. That protection must be built into its structure from the first day of its existence.

SECTION 11 — CALL FOR LEGISLATION AND CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

11.1 The President calls upon Congress to enact the **American Civilian Sovereignty Act**, converting the prohibitions of this Order into permanent federal law with civil and criminal penalties, a private right of action for every American citizen, and the establishment of the Constitutional People's Counsel as a permanent Article I officer.

11.2 The President further calls upon Congress to propose the **American Civilian Sovereignty Amendment** to the Constitution, establishing that the rights protecting Americans from government overreach apply equally to corporations operating at population scale, and permanently enshrining the Constitutional People's Counsel as the enforcement mechanism for those protections.

11.3 Executive orders can be reversed by future administrations. The American people deserve statutory and constitutional protection that no future president, Congress, or court can quietly dismantle. The Cordova administration will work with any member of Congress, of any party, to build that protection.

SECTION 12 — EFFECTIVE DATE

This Order is effective immediately upon signature.
